Acts 15:36-41

I Corinthians 15:58 reads, *“So my dear brothers and sisters, stand strong. Do not let anything move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your work in the Lord is never wasted.”* (NCV) This verse reveals the commitment Christians should possess as they engage in their ministerial duties. Every believer has been given an assignment from God to build up and to advance His Kingdom. There is no way an individual can effectively fulfill their task without being devoted to carrying it out in spite of life’s problems and pressures.
