Information Needed to Connect People to Christ

Acts 2:22-32

Romans 16:1, 2 read, *"I recommend to you our sister Phoebe, who is a helper in the church of Cenchrea. I ask you to accept her in the Lord in the way God's people should. Help her with anything she needs, because she has helped me and many other people also."* (NCV) These verses reveal glowing words Apostle Paul had to say in an attempt to be a reference for a woman moving to Rome. No individual makes it successfully through life without the support of other people. Even those who don't know the Lord need believers to help them establish a personal relationship with God through Jesus. This lesson is designed to examine an encounter that took place on the Day of Pentecost to point out information needed by children of God to connect people to Christ.

1. Witnesses for Christ should possess knowledge about the Actions of Jesus to connect people to Him.
Verse 22
"People of Israel, listen to these words: Jesus from Nazareth was a very special man. God clearly showed this to you by the miracles, wonders, and signs he did through Jesus. You all know this, because it happened right here among you." (NCV)
2. Witnesses for Christ should possess knowledge about the Crucifixion of Jesus to connect people to Him.
Verse 23
"Jesus was given to you, and with the help of those who don't know the law, you put him to death by nailing him to a cross. But this was God's plan which he had made long ago; he knew all this would happen." (NCV)
3. Witnesses for Christ should possess knowledge about the Ressurrection of Jesus to connect people to Him.
Verse 24
"God raised Jesus from the dead and set him free from the pain of death, because death could not hold him." (NCV)
