**II Kings 6:15-18**

I Samuel 30:6 reads, *“And David was greatly distressed; for the people spake of stoning him, because the soul of all the people was grieved, every man for his sons and for his daughters: but David encouraged himself in the LORD his God.”* (KJV) This verse records how one individual responded to a tumultuous time in his life.
