“Don’t Be Scurred”

I Samuel 15:22-26

II Timothy 1:7 reads, “*For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind.*” (KJV) This verse records words of encouragement spoken by a spiritual father to his spiritual son who was young in his ministerial call. No one is ever beyond situations or circumstances that can cause them to become timid and tempted by Satan. Even men and women of the Bible made bad decisions as a result of being fearful. This lesson is designed to examine an episode in the life of King Saul to point out dangers of being “scurred” of people.

Verses 3, 9, 12
“Now go, attack the Amalekites and totally destroy all that belongs to them. Do not spare them; put to death men and women, children and infants, cattle and sheep, camels and donkeys.’ 9) But Saul and the army spared Agag and the best of the sheep and cattle, the fat calves and lambs—everything that was good. These they were unwilling to destroy completely, but everything that was despised and weak they totally destroyed. 12) Early in the morning Samuel got up and went to meet Saul, but he was told, “Saul has gone to Carmel. There he has set up a monument in his own honor and has turned and gone on down to Gilgal.” (NIV)
