When the Philistines saw that their champion was dead, they turned and ran. 52) Then the men of Israel and Judah gave a great shout of triumph and rushed after the Philistines, chasing them as far as Gath and the gates of Ekron. The bodies of the dead and wounded Philistines were strewn all along the road from Shaaraim, as far as Gath and Ekron.” (NLT)

I Samuel 17:57
“As soon as David returned from killing Goliath, Abner brought him to Saul with the Philistine’s head still in his hand.” (NLT)

II Chronicles 20:24, 25
“So when the army of Judah arrived at the lookout point in the wilderness, all they saw were dead bodies lying on the ground as far as they could see. Not a single one of the enemy had escaped. 25) King Jehoshaphat and his men went out to gather the plunder. They found vast amounts of equipment, clothing, and other valuables—more than they could carry. There was so much plunder that it took them three days just to collect it all!” (NLT)
