Acts 9:10-17

Matthew 5:16 reads, *“In the same way, you should be a light for other people. Live so that they will see the good things you do and will praise your Father in heaven.”* (NCV) This verse records words spoken by Jesus regarding the way his disciples should carry themselves.
